I AM STILL A WORK IN PROGRESS, BUT I HAVE MADE MANY STRIDES. I MUST SAY THAT EMOTIONALLY I AM IN A BETTER PLACE; MY SELF-ESTEEM AND SELF-CONFIDENCE HAVE IMPROVED DRASTICALLY. I AM AWARE THAT IN REALITY RESOURCES ARE LIMITED, BUT I HUMBLY PLEAD TO YOUR CONSCIENCE AND SENSE OF HUMANITY TO CONTINUE TO MAKE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN SHELTERS A PRIORITY AND ALLOT THE NECESSARY FUNDING TO REFLECT SAME. BECAUSE VIOLENCE DOES NOT DISCRIMINATE. IT CAN HAPPEN TO ANYONE, YOUR MOM, YOUR SISTER, YOUR NIECE AND YES IT CAN ALSO HAPPEN TO YOU.

Hope Stories: Angelica's story

WHILE LIVING WITH HER ABUSER SHE KNEW THAT SOMETHING WAS NOT RIGHT, BUT COULDN'T RECOGNIZE THAT WHAT WAS HAPPENING TO HER WAS ABUSE. "AT THAT TIME, I THOUGHT THAT ABUSE WAS ONLY PHYSICAL. I WAS ASHAMED TO TALK ABOUT WHAT WAS HAPPENING TO ME BECAUSE I WAS WITHOUT FAMILY OR RELATIVES. I WAS NEW IN CANADA AND I DIDN'T KNOW MUCH ABOUT MY RIGHTS".

WHEN ANGELICA FIRST ENTERED NORTH YORK WOMEN'S SHELTER, SHE WAS IN DENIAL. SHE THOUGHT, "I CAN'T BELIEVE THIS IS HAPPENING TO ME. SOME DAYS I FELT THAT I SHOULD JUST GIVE UP BECAUSE I COULDN'T BEAR IT ANY LONGER. THERE WAS ANOTHER PART OF ME THAT ENCOURAGED ME TO BE BRAVE, AND THIS ENABLED ME TO SUCCEED DURING THAT DIFFICULT TIME." NOW ANGELICA SEES HERSELF AS $\mathcal A$ PERSON REBORN. SHE NOW VOLUNTEERS AS $\mathcal A$ CULTURAL INTERPRETER FOR THE BARBRA SCHLIFER COMMEMORATIVE CLINIC AND IS OFTEN AT THE SHELTER INTERPRETING FOR SPANISH-SPEAKING CLIENTS.

"I THINK THAT PEOPLE SHOULD STRUGGLE WITH THEIR PROBLEMS EVEN THOUGH THEY FEEL OVERWHELMED BY THEM. AFTER THE RAIN THERE IS ALWAYS $\mathcal A$ RAINBOW FULL OF HOPE AND DREAMS TO FOLLOW."

SARA'S STORY

I MET MY HUSBAND SHORTLY AFTER I CAME TO CANADA. I FELL IN LOVE WITH HIM AND SOON WE WERE MARRIED. TWO MONTHS AFTER WE GOT MARRIED, HIS WONDERFUL PERSONALITY DISAPPEARED. I WAS ABLE TO SEE HIM UNMASKED; HIS REAL SELF HAD BEEN HIDDEN SKILLFULLY FROM ALL OF US.

ONE NEW YEAR'S EVE MY HUSBAND WAS DRUNK AND BEGAN ATTACKING ME. HE GRABBED ME BY MY HAIR AND THREW ME TO THE GROUND, KICKED ME AND THEN HE STARTED CHOKING ME. I RAN OUTSIDE ONTO THE DRIVEWAY AND FORTUNATELY A CAR PASSED BY, THE DRIVER SAW HIM CHOKING ME, HE WAS MY RESCUING ANGEL. HE CALLED THE POLICE. I WAS SENT TO HOSPITAL AND MY HUSBAND WAS CHARGED FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND WAS SENT TO JAIL.

AFTER 1 WAS RELEASED FROM HOSPITAL 1 FOUND MYSELF AT THE NORTH YORK WOMEN'S SHELTER. SOON AFTER MY ARRIVAL, STAFF BEGAN TALKING TO ME; THEY TOLD ME THAT THE ABUSE WAS NOT MY FAULT, THAT MY ABUSIVE HUSBAND WAS CHOOSING THIS BEHAVIOUR IN ORDER TO HAVE POWER AND CONTROL OVER ME. THEY GAVE ME HOPE. 1 LEARNED THAT ABUSE DOESN'T ONLY HAPPEN IN CERTAIN CULTURES; THAT ABUSE HAPPENS TO ALL WOMEN REGARDLESS OF RACE, CULTURE, INCOME, EDUCATION LEVEL, AGE, RELIGION, AND SOCIAL CLASS.

THE COUNSELLORS AT THE SHELTER HELPED ME TO LOOK AHEAD INSTEAD OF FOCUSING ON MY PAST, THEY DEDICATED THEIR EFFORTS AND TIME TO GIVE ME AND OTHER WOMEN ANOTHER LIFE, $\mathcal A$ LIFE THAT WE DESERVE TO HAVE. I MOVED INTO MY NEW APARTMENT THIS MONTH. LIFE IS SMILING AT ME AGAIN; I FEEL LIKE $\mathcal A$ BUTTERFLY FLYING IN THE BLUE SKY OF FREEDOM. I AM SURE THAT I COULD HAVE NOT MADE IT IF I WAS NOT IN THIS SHELTER. NO WORDS CAN EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION FOR THE NORTH YORK WOMEN'S SHELTER.

Hope Stories: RITA'S STORY

RITA LEFT HER ABUSER AND HAD BEEN LIVING OUT OF HER CAR. SHE STAYED WITH THE SHELTER FOR FOUR MONTHS, WAS ABLE TO GET THE SUPPORT SHE NEEDED AT THAT TIME. CONFIDENCE WAS SHATTERED. SHE DID NOT KNOW HOW LONG SHE WAS GOING TO ABLE TO STAY AT THE SHELTER AND WAS NERVOUS FOR HER FUTURE. HAD TO LEAVE HER JOB AS HER ABUSER STALKED HER. AT FIRST THE POLICE WOULD NOT BRING HER TO THE SHELTER AND ALWAYS BROUGHT HER BACK HOME. SHE LIVED IN HER CAR UNTIL SHE HAD TO GO BACK. FINALLY A NEIGHBOUR TOLD HER ABOUT THE SHELTER. THAT NIGHT SHE LEFT. NINE YEARS LATER SHE HAD HER JOB BACK, AND BOUGHT HER OWN HOUSE.




