We are privileged to be a part of a woman's life as she rebuilds her self-esteem and recognizes her self-worth. There is nothing more rewarding than the smiling face of a child who once was filled with fear, to look into a child's eyes and see trust rather than fear.

Our dedicated team of staff, volunteers, community partners and our generous donors stand with us as we fight to eradicate violence and poverty for women. We are forever grateful for their ongoing support and belief that together we are creating new possibilities in the lives of children, a future that is filled with opportunity and hope.

Reflecting on the past 30 years, we have seen much change; a woman used to return to her partner on average 15 times before moving forward. We do still have a long way to go but will continue to support families with their choices, providing options, support and programs to both women and children.

HAVEN'S STORY...

HAVEN AND HER CHILDREN, MATI AND LEA, ARRIVED AT NORTH YORK WOMEN'S SHELTER AS A WALK - IN. HAVEN WAS OFFERED SUPPORT AND OPTIONS INCLUDING TO COME & STAY AT SHELTER, THAT WAS ALMOST 6 YEARS AGO. WE REMEMBER THINKING SHE REALLY NEEDED TO COME IN FOR HER OWN AND HER CHILDREN'S SAFETY BUT SHE DIDN'T AND WE HOPED SHE HAD BEEN GIVEN THE INFORMATION SHE NEEDED. AND THAT SHE COULD REMEMBER ALL INFORMATION WE HAD DISCUSSED AS IT WASN'T SAFE FOR HER TO TAKE ANY WRITTEN MATERIAL WITH HER.

A FEW MONTHS LATER HAVEN, MATI AND LEA SHOWED UP AT THE DOOR OF THE SHELTER TO STAY. THE SHELTER WAS ON HIGH ALERT BECAUSE OF HER PARTNERS THREATS ON THEIR LIVES MOST OF THE TIME SHE WAS AT THE SHELTER. HER 2 CHILDREN REALLY CONNECTED WITH 1 OF OUR CHILDREN'S PROGRAM WORKERS. ONE OF THE STORIES THAT MATI AND LEA SHARED WAS THAT THEY WERE VERY ANGRY – THEY LOVED THEIR FATHER BUT HATED HOW HE TREATED THEIR MOTHER AND EACH OF THEM & THAT THEY FELT LIKE A FAILURE, LIKE THEY HAD FAILED THEIR MOM & EACH OTHER BECAUSE THEY COULDN'T KEEP THEIR FAMILY SAFE. THIS FROM 11 & 13 YEAR OLD CHILDREN...

CHILDREN LEARN WHAT THEY LIVE. 75% OF ALL CHILDREN WHO WITNESS ABUSE IN THE HOME WILL BECOME PERPETRATORS OR VICTIMS OF VIOLENCE THEMSELVES. THE ONLY TIME THIS CHANGES IS WHEN THERE IS AN INTERVENTION, THE CHILDREN REALIZE THAT WHAT THEY HAVE SEEN BETWEEN THEIR PARENTS IS NOT A HEALTHY RELATIONSHIP, IS NOT A RELATIONSHIP TO SEEK FOR THEMSELVES.

WHILE HAVEN, MATI AND LEA WERE AT THE SHELTER, WE WORKED TOGETHER TO WRITE A SAFETY PLAN FOR EACH OF THEM, TO PROVIDE COUNSELLING SO THEY COULD CONNECT AGAIN TO WHO EACH ONE THEM WERE AND WANTED TO BE. WE PROVIDED SUPPORT FOR HAVEN WHILE SHE LOOKED FOR AND SECURED EMPLOYMENT, AND RECONNECTED WITH HER OWN FAMILY. TOWARDS THE END OF THEIR 8 MONTH STAY, MATI AND LEA THANKED US FOR KEEPING THEM SAFE, FOR SUPPORTING THEIR FAMILY AND FOR THE BELIEF THAT TOGETHER THEY ARE STRONGER THAN EVER BEFORE.

HAVEN HAS EXPRESSED HER GRATITUDE MANY TIMES OVER AND BELIEVES SHE, MATI AND LEA NEVER WOULD HAVE MADE IT TO TODAY ALIVE WITHOUT THE ONGOING EMOTIONAL SUPPORT AND SAFE HOUSING. SHE NOW WORKS FULL-TIME, BOUGHT A HOME ABOUT 3 YEARS AGO, HER CHILDREN ARE HONOR STUDENTS IN SCHOOL AND THEY ARE ALL VERY ACTIVE IN THE COMMUNITY. SHE IS A WOMAN OF TREMENDOUS COURAGE AND HAS OVERCOME MORE THAN MOST. HAVEN IS A WOMAN WHO HAS BROKEN THE CYCLE OF VIOLENCE AND IS A TRUE ROLE MODEL TO MATI, LEA AND TO MANY OTHER WOMEN.






